MEMBER OF THE YEAR – In the December Newsletter we announced that Jimmy Jeffries was selected as the 2020 Member of the Year, an honor he very much deserves. Due to technical difficulties, no photo was available at that time. Jimmy is the Club's Equipment Maintenance Director. Jimmy, thank you for everything you voluntarily do for all of us! Last Saturday evening, 1/16/21, he alerted the Board to a missing loading door on Skeet High House #2. Being on the north side of the houses, the plywood doors have suffered terribly from moisture and lack of sunshine, and because they are on the north side, most people never see them.

Clem Ellis made a quick repair the next morning. The Board acted swiftly to approve replacing all seven loading doors and frames with metal ones.



LAST CALL – DUES for 2021 – Send your 2021 dues check to: **RCGC - DUES, PO Box 811, Reidsville NC 27323** Payment must be in our hands before January 31st. **After the 31st, you will also owe a penalty equal to the dues amount. ID/Gate Cards of non-renewing members will be deactivated.** Members may purchase any number of years in advance at the current rate. Annual members pay \$150. Seniors (65 or older) pay \$75. Charter Members owe \$0. On the memo line of your check write “2021 dues for _____” Fill in the member’s name. We need the member’s name on the check to be certain that funds are properly credited, especially if you pay with a company check, a check signed by someone else, or if we know you by a nickname. If your phone, email or mailing address have changed, please include a note with your payment. If you have paid in advance for multiple years and are uncertain when your membership expires, contact Lil. **If you have a Life Membership or if you have already paid dues for 2021, you may ignore the reminders which are being sent to everyone.**

CONCRETE PROJECTS – that the Board approved last month are well underway. The pad has been poured for a new Clay Target Storage Building. It will be located to the west side of the Clubhouse parking lot behind the Blockhouse Bathrooms. The walkway around the Clubhouse has been completed with a short extension to the flagpole. A pad has been poured under the Utility Range shelter where permanent benches will be installed.



WORKDAY JANUARY 30th – As you know, if a month has 5 Saturdays, the 5th Saturday is always a Club Workday. It was recently pointed out to us that many members think you have to be a young, strong person capable of doing heavy manual labor in order to help on a workday. This misconception may be keeping members away. There are always projects to be accomplished. Many of them are simple light-weight tasks with which almost

anyone could help. Please come to the Club at 9AM Sat.1/30 and we will find a chore to suit you. The Club has cleaning supplies. Bring tools that might be useful. **THE CLUB WILL BE CLOSED TO CASUAL SHOOTING UNTIL THE WORKDAY IS OVER. (Usually before Noon.)**

THE 2021 LOCK CODE – The lock code will not change until February 22nd, after the final deadline for dues payment and after Lil has had a chance to delete delinquent and non-renewing members and deactivate their gate cards. Members in good standing will be mailed (US Mail) a copy of the February Newsletter with the new code. Since we also have to allow for printing and delivery time, continue to use the 2020 code until then. If we do not have your current address you will not get the new code. If after the 22nd you encounter a padlock that does not open with the new code, try the 2020 code. Then please notify Lil so that lock can be cleaned and reset.

SWIPE YOUR ID CARD – Members must use their ID card to enter or leave the property and must wear their card while on Club property so that it is visible to other members. Present your card to the reader even if the gate is being held open for a special event or if you are riding in the same vehicle with another member. Pause after you pass through the electric gate for the few seconds it takes for the gate to close. If you have trouble with your card contact Lil at 336-342-5573.

RCGC IS OPEN TO MEMBERS 365 DAYS PER YEAR, unless otherwise announced. Always check the website before going to the range. Bring other guns in case the range

you intended to use is occupied. Shooting is allowed from dawn until dusk. The Club closes at 10 PM. This is a volunteer organization. We need every member's help to maintain what we have for all of us to enjoy.

READ ALL OF THE SIGNS FOR THE RANGE YOU ARE USING – We have encountered a number of members recently who were shooting a weapon on a range where it is prohibited. The members claimed they didn't know that they were in violation and were surprised when asked to read a sign they had walked past many times. The rules are for your safety and will be enforced. **ALL Shooting on the Centerfire Rifle Range and the Rimfire Rifle Range must be done from the firing line shelters.**

REMOVE YOUR TARGETS, PLACE YOUR EMPTY CARTRIDGE CASES IN THE BUCKETS PROVIDED and EMPTY THE TRASH – **Your visit to the Club is not over until you clean-up after yourself.**



ALL FOOD SCRAPS, USED PAPER PLATES, FOOD PACKAGING and discarded baby diapers, etc. must go into a dumpster.

WE RECYCLE – PLEASE DO NOT PUT CARTRIDGE CASES IN THE TRASH. We can recycle the metals you do not want. We accept brass, aluminum, and nickel plated cartridge cases. This includes .22s.

ALUMINUM CANS – There are blue collection bins in the clubhouse for Aluminum soda cans. Please do not put TRASH into soda cans or into the collection bins. Please do not put plastic bottles into the collection bins. To help prevent bug problems, please rinse and drain soda cans before depositing them in a blue collection bin. Aluminum foil is not acceptable.

ATTENTION LEAD SCROUNGERS – You may NOT dig into the berms to harvest lead. You MAY pick it up by hand if it has been washed to the surface. Do Not climb the berms or otherwise disturb the soil.

GOLF CARTS – are for use by members. Only licensed drivers may operate them.

Always return the carts to their proper storage locations and follow the printed instructions to see that they are recharged for the next user.
